Introduction & Progress Update

Griffiths have been appointed by Isle of Anglesey County Council to construct the latest section of the Llangefni Link Road and work commenced on 22nd May 2017.

Section 4 will consist of a new roundabout on the A5114 on the outskirts of the town and a length of carriageway linking it to the Llangefni Industrial Estate road. The new link road will help secure significant economic benefits for Llangefni and Anglesey as a whole. When all four sections are completed, it will link the Grŵp Llandrillo Menai Penraig campus to the A5114 at the Lon Glanhwfa/Industrial Estate Road junction.

Completion of the link road will enable growth and expansion of the Grŵp Llandrillo Menai Penraig campus and provide improved access to the Enterprise Zone sites. Additionally, the scheme will improve linkages to the A55 and help overcome traffic congestion in Llangefni Town Centre.

Progress Update

Work is progressing very well with the first phase of the works nearly complete. This section of the project included site clearance, demolition of the existing retaining wall, extensive earthworks and the installation of surface water drainage, ducting for street lighting and kerbs. The first stage of surfacing is due to start in early August. This will then enable us to divert traffic onto the new road to provide access to safely continue construction on the existing junction.

The project is currently ahead of programme with completion due in January 2018.

ICE Bridge to Schools Programme

Griffiths is committed to raising the profile of the construction industry and enthusing potential Civil Engineers. This commitment has led to the development of a number of programmes that engage with local schools, colleges and universities.

One of which is the Institution of Civil Engineers (ICE) Bridge to Schools programme, a hands-on experience for pupils which showcases Design and Engineering at its simplistic best, in the form of a 35 foot Cable Stay Bridge.

Over 150 Year 9 pupils from Ysgol David Hughes, Menai Bridge took part in the ICE Bridge to Schools project before the Whitsun half term holidays. Split into their registration classes, the seven groups each had an opportunity to build a miniature version of the Second Severn Crossing. The pupils experienced bridge building using the model cable-stayed bridge, all kitted out in personal protective equipment – hard hats, high-vis vests, gloves and goggles.



After the bridge was completed, each pupil was given the opportunity to walk across it to test their engineering skills.
