Progress

Work along the A3088 Western Relief Road is progressing on schedule. Night time closures for surfacing work are due to be completed on this phase by 2nd November. A diversion route is in place each weekday evening from 8pm until 6am whilst work takes place. Pedestrian and cycle access are maintained during these works.

Footways near the Bluebell roundabout and the cycle/footpath through Abbey Manor have been surfaced.

Work on the retaining wall in Western Avenue is nearing completion. The southbound lane closure will remain in Western Avenue whilst additional drainage and kerbing works are undertaken. We anticipate that the one-way system in operation in Western Avenue will remain until Monday 5th November.

Upcoming Works

On Monday 5th November night time closures will be implemented from 8pm to 6am weekdays to undertake surfacing work between the Westlands and Bluebell Roundabouts. A signed diversion route will be in place and provision for pedestrians and cyclists will be maintained.

Also on Monday 5th November, a one-way system will be re-instated in Lufton Way and a signed diversion route will be in place. Traffic will be able to access Lufton Way from the Preston Road Roundabout but not exit from Lufton Way to the Roundabout. We anticipate that work in Lufton Way will be completed by 21st December.
