SA1 Phase 7

Project Bulletin March 2019



Over the last few months a range of works have transformed the area around the Prince of Wales Dock and coastal seafront. The area has been enhanced with extensive tree planting and public furniture. Over 3000m² of paving has been laid, 310m³ concrete, 400m granite kerbs and channels with around 220m stainless steel handrails to complement the area. Hidden away is a combined length of drainage pipes measuring approximately 525m to date.
